

## User Guide VaPro™ Catheters






































- 10. Using your forefinger and thumb of your non-dominant hand squeeze penis gently to open the urethral opening. With your dominant hand, insert the protective tip until the plate comes in contact with urethral opening.
- With the penis stretched and in upright position, insert the catheter forward until urine starts to flow.

- 12. Once urine flow has stopped, slowly withdraw the catheter. If urine flows again, pause until urine stops. After you're sure the bladder is empty, remove the catheter completely. Reposition the foreskin (if present).
- 13. Catheter may be disposed of in a waste bin. DO NOT FLUSH DOWN TOILET.

14. Wash your hands.

Not made with natural rubber latex. Intermittent catheter not made with PVC or phthalates. This product consists of: polyurethane sleeve, and thermoplastic elastomer tip and tubing.

Indications and Intended Use: This intermittent catheter is a flexible tubular device that is inserted through the urethra by male, female and paediatric (pediatric) patients who need to drain urine from the bladder.

**WARNINGS** Do not use if package is damaged or opened. To help reduce the potential for infection and/or other complications, do not reuse. If discomfort or any sign of trauma occurs, discontinue use immediately and consult your healthcare practitioner.

Precautions: Please consult your healthcare practitioner before using this product if any of the following conditions are present:

- Severed urethra
- Pronounced stricture
- Urethritis inflammation of the urethra
- Epididymitis inflammation of the epididymis (testicle tube)
- Unexplained urethral bleeding
- False passage
- Prostatitis inflammation of the prostate gland

Self-catheterisation (catheterization) should follow the plan of care and advice given by your healthcare practitioner and be carried out only in accordance with the instructions for use provided. Because catheterisation (catheterization) frequency varies by person, the recommended frequency of your catheterisation (catheterization) should be provided by your healthcare practitioner.
